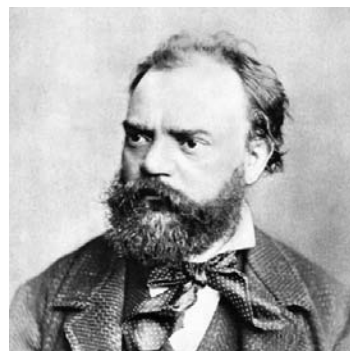

The Czech Tradition is one of the most significant in the whole of Western music. The national style which developed during the 19th century has contributed much fine music by many composers, and remains central to the repertoire of musicians the world over. Our weekend will explore aspects of this rich legacy, with music examples on excellent hi-fi equipment including DVD with large screen.

The Best Western **Wroxton House Hotel** is set in the beautiful thatched village of Wroxton. Dating in parts from 1649 and beautifully appointed, it is an idyllic retreat only 4 miles from Banbury, on the edge of the Cotswolds.

Terry Barfoot is Director of Arts in Residence and writes widely on music for Britain's leading journals, orchestras, festivals and record companies. He lectures at venues throughout the country and is Publications Consultant to the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra.

Gwyn Parry-Jones studied with David Wynne and Alun Hoddinott, and graduated from Manchester University and the Royal Northern College of Music. He played for some years with the Halle and BBC Philharmonic Orchestras, and for many years lectured at Reading University, leaving recently to concentrate on his musical interests, principally conducting, performing and lecturing.
