Verdi is one of the great composers and his operas are constantly in the repertories of the world's opera houses. The powerful combination of an unsurpassed melodic gift with an intuitive feel for dramatic structure accounts for his enduring popularity. During the course of our weekend we will explore aspects of his extraordinary life, and in particular *Aida* and the *Messa da Requiem*, two of his finest works, which date from a critical point in his career. Our musical examples using CD and DVD will be played on excellent hi-fi equipment.

There has been an estate at Wokefield since the first house was built in the 1560s. Set in 250 acres of Berkshire parkland, its history is etched in different architectural features, including the historic Mansion House.

Terry Barfoot writes widely on music for Britain's leading journals, orchestras, festivals and record companies. He lectures at Oxford University and venues throughout the country, is Publications Consultant to the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra and the Director of Arts in Residence. **Gwyn Parry-Jones** studied with David Wynne and Alun Hoddinott, and graduated from the Royal Northern College of Music. He played for some years with the Halle and BBC Philharmonic Orchestras, and for many years lectured at Reading University, leaving recently to concentrate on his musical interests, principally conducting, performing and lecturing.
